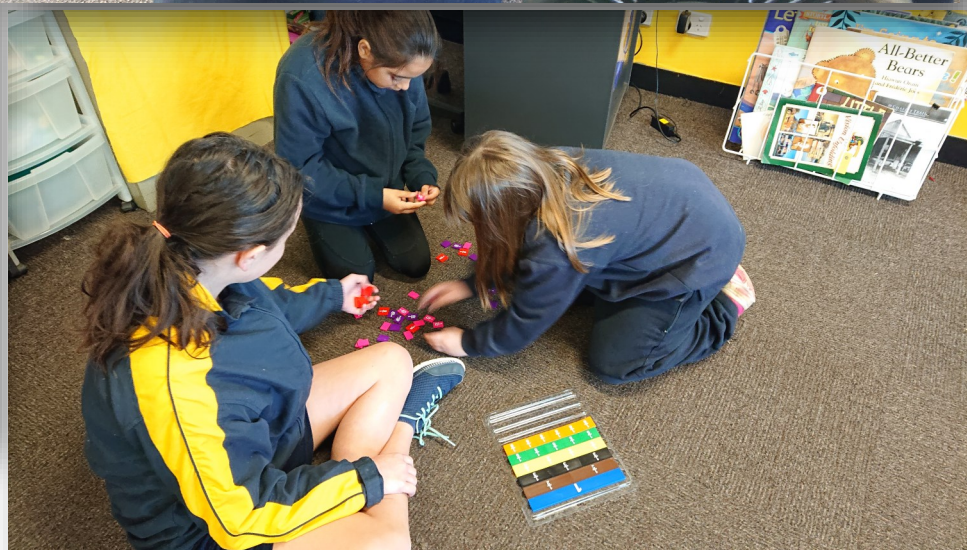
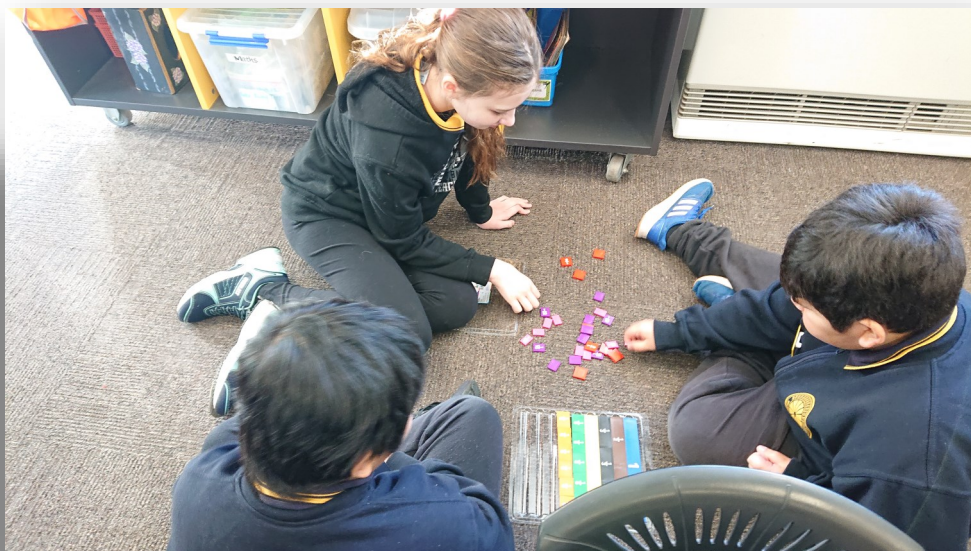

### What's Happening in the Patch?

It has been a very busy few weeks in the Patch and we certainly welcomed the wonderful rain. Hopefully, the forecast rain for this week will also fall. As the students have been learning, rain not only brings the fresh water but also drops very important nitrogen onto our garden. Nitrogen is one of the key elements in many fertilisers- but there is nothing better than the real stuff falling from the skies.

After learning all about bees, the students in the garden classes decided that there should be some more flowers around our school to attract bees to our vegetable patch and our fruit trees. So they have transformed the old garden bed behind the library. The Year 3 students worked really hard preparing the bed by transferring a heap of soil, compost and mulch and watering it all. The Year 4 students planted out bulbs and flower seedlings, added snail bait and watered. It was wonderful to see the teamwork and everyone enjoyed having the opportunity to work with the big garden tools. We collect weather data very week, and last week when the 'feels like' temperature was just 2°, the classes stayed indoors and learnt interesting things about weather maps- for example the isobar lines that tell us how strong the winds will be and about cold weather systems that come from Antarctica and bring us cold winds. We also learnt how to construct a graph on the ipads. I think we were all surprised how simple it was and it was a great way to show some of the weather data we had collected during the term.

But most exciting of all was the testing for the Wheelbarrow Licences. Everyone had to load and unload a wheelbarrow safely, walk forwards, walk backwards and weave between some cones without losing their load of tools or knocking over the cones. There was a 100% success rate for each class- such an amazing effort. The children encouraged each other along and helped by taking photos of their classmates as they went through their test so they could add the photos to their Kitchen Garden Diary.

It has been busy in the kitchen too. All classes have learnt how to make their own pasta as well as a few new Italian words. Everyone had an attempt at making different pasta shapes one week and then the following week some students made pasta, other students made the pasta sauce. In the past week, we made Vegetable Soup, Fruit Muffins, Brazilian Cheese Bread, and continually practised those dishwashing skills and knife skills.



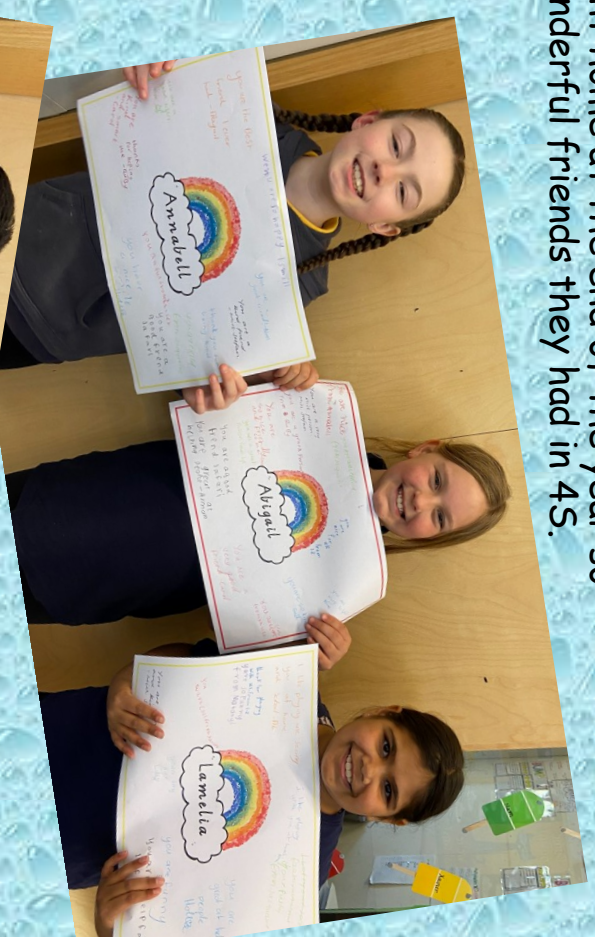
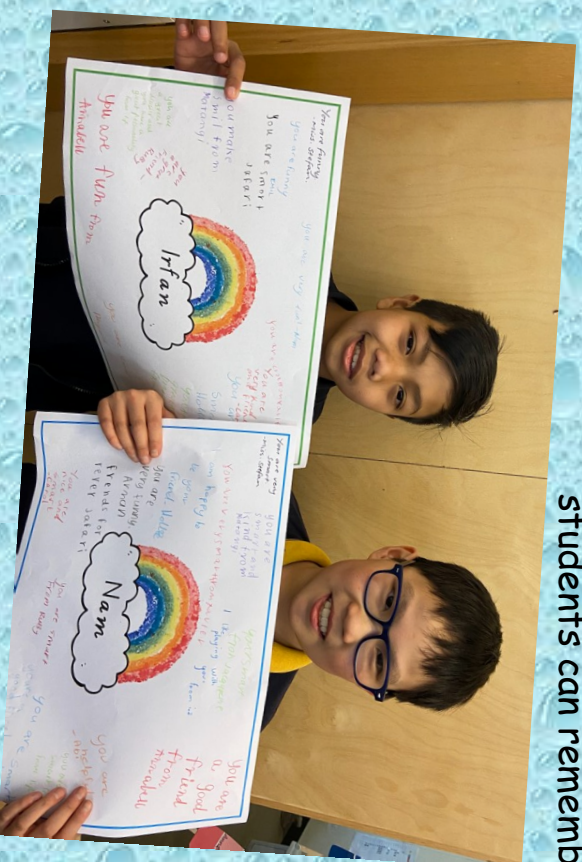
#### ENVIRO CLUB NEWS
